



Embracing Wholeness: An Earth Perspective for Covenantal Living

This is the second in a two-part series about covenantal living. Part 2 is designed to build on last year's study as it explores the ways God has called us to live in covenantal relationship with all of creation and challenges readers to work toward stronger and healthier relationships with creation, their communities, themselves, and God. Chapter 1 begins the text with the theological and biblical foundation for our covenantal relationship with creation and moves forward into our community, our relationships, and our very selves. Each chapter explores both our personal and corporate responsibilities to those around us and addresses current issues, such as climate change, social responsibility and justice concerns. The focus of this study is both personal and communal. Readers will explore their own relationship with money, the money choices available to us, and how we individually and collectively respond in light of our faith. Missionary Conferences of the United Methodist Church in the United States

The aim of this study is to give an overview of the three missionary conferences in The United Methodist Church, the contexts out of which they grew and their current engagements: The Alaska United Methodist Conference, Red Bird Missionary Conference, and the Oklahoma Indian Missionary Conference are a hybrid of home and international missionary work. What does the future look like for these conferences? The General Board of Global Ministries and the missionary conferences are exploring best operational and structural options for maximizing mission and ministry going forward in these unique locations. These dialogues, different in each case, have begun and will take place across the 2017-2020 quadrennium. HIGHLIGHTING PERRY UNITED METHODIST WOMEN FELLOWSHIP AND SERVICE

We consider all the women of our church UMW members. At our afternoon monthly meetings we average 6 to 8 women, but all step-up to help when asked and support our projects.

To give you an idea of what we do, in January we have a bake-less bake sale or pinch-an-inch around your waist and donate per inch!

February is a pizza party and cards afternoon. Each member brings a small pizza with their favorite toppings to share. Then we eat, play cards, talk and laugh a lot. A great afternoon of fellowship.

After our March pot luck dinner we have a mystery auction and the money we raise pays for a pizza party in April at the Olive Branch, an assisted living facility. We bring our families and eat with the residents.

May is our Spring Fling for all our female relatives and friends. Food is a pot luck. We give a door prize and have entertainment following our meal.

In June we host a reception for our high school graduates and present them with a gift.

In summer we pick a date for lunch out and a movie for all the ladies of our church and their friends.

Our community looks forward to our rummage sales in April and October. A few years ago in November we added a Christmas sale of new or gently used decorations. In December is our Christmas party at a restaurant with a \$5.00 gift exchange.

Also in December we have fun giving away the money we've earned to:

Peacock Tree Farm - Trees for Troops Project Salvation Army Safe Center Grand Rapids UMW Community House Small gifts for our pastor, organist, treasurer, secretary and power point operator.

In November we donate to the Perry, Morrice, Shaftsburg Emergence Services and Thanksgiving dinner for our janitor and family.

A few other things we do is help with major purchases for our church, buy 40 copies of the Upper Room devotionals, buy cleaning supplies, paper products and food for our kitchen. Also once a month we hold bingo games at the Olive Branch and furnish the prizes.

We also support Respite Volunteers of Shiawassee by hosting volunteer training at our church, donate gift cards for office supplies and donate door prizes for Purse Bingo - a Respite fund raiser. Many of our members are Respite volunteers.

Thank you for your generous support to missions! Here is some useful information that will help the money you send be processed as efficiently as possible:

- Please accompany all checks with a form. These can be downloaded at www.unitedmethodistwomen.org.
 Once there, click on For Members & Leaders. Then click on Roles & Responsibilities. From there Click on Local United Methodist Women. To the right (in blue) you will see Treasurers' Remittance Forms and Login. For those who don't have access to a computer perhaps someone at your church could download some for photocopying. If this is not an option, contact me and I will get them to you. When ordering a Special Mission Recognition Pin, the amount owed is located down on the bottom of that form. This is usually the "basic" at \$40.
- Please do **not** make checks out to me, Jackie Ricketts, or to W. Michigan Conference. All checks can be made out to Lansing District UMW (at least until we are told what our new name will be.) I will be sure that your money is sent on to the Conference in a timely manner.
- All remittance forms must arrive to me by Dec. 5th as I have a deadline to the conference of Dec. 12th.

PURPOSE OF UNITED METHODIST WOMEN

The organized unit of United Methodist Women shall be a community of women whose purpose is to know God and to experience freedom as whole persons through Jesus Christ; to develop a creative, supportive fellowship; and to expand concepts of mission through participation in the global ministries of the church.

Fifty Years in Mission to Women, Children, Youth, and Men





It started in the mid l960's when Mason Methodist Youth Fellowship members saw a need to provide clothing for those less fortunate. That was the humble beginning of an ever-growing mission which is now under the supervision of Mason First United Methodist Women. Fifty years later our free Clothing Bank is open twice a month, the first and third Tuesdays, and on emergency call to people in need from throughout the greater Mason area.

The Clothing Bank provides a wide variety of clothing and accessories for women, men and children. A number of dedicated volunteers, both women and men, meet each Tuesday morning at the church to sort the donated items collected that week and to organize them in our clothing closet by size and type. Out-of-season items are stored for use when needed. Some surplus clothing is sent directly to Goodwill while cotton items that are worn are saved for a local furniture refinisher. We have received donations of returned shoes from a local shoe store as well as other items from local stores. The Clothing Bank also provides much needed bedding, which goes very quickly, as well as household items and small toys and books for children. Warm coats, hats and mittens for all ages go quickly in the fall.

Twice a year a rummage sale is held to clear the previous year's inventory of seasonal items and to offer clothing for the coming season. New donations for the rummage sale are welcome the week before and week of the rummage sale. Proceeds from

these sales are used by United Methodist Women to support a variety of local mission projects.

In 2017 the clothing bank was open to the public 21 days plus emergency calls. An approximate total of 182 different clients were served during 401 visits to the Clothing Bank. These people came from 15 different cities. Although Mason residents used it the most, clients came from Dansville, Dimondale, Holt, Jackson, Lansing, Leslie. Onondaga, Stockbridge and other area towns. In 2016 hours that the Clothing Bank is open were extended to the evening hours of 6:00 to 8:00 to accommodate those who were unable to attend at the 1:30 to 3:30 hours.

The only requirement to receive items from the Bank is that the need be real (we depend on the honesty of the recipients) and the request to pay it forward when or if they get a chance. Each client is limited to two 13-gallon plastic bags of clothing per visit and no more than one visit per month.

Our inventory is always changing. Items that aren't sold at the annual rummage sales are donated to various organizations and churches. One Lansing area church re-sorts our excess clothing and distributes it to agencies for the homeless in the Detroit area.
