Last Fall was when local units filled out their Local Unit Officers Forms and returned them to me, believing that our lives would continue as usual. Despite the changes & challenges we are facing, I'm still asking for your 2021 Local Unit Officers Forms. Aren't you glad some things haven't changed? You can find the form in this newsletter with directions on how to get the information to me.

I thought it would be interesting to share some of the information we gathered. According to the forms returned to me last Fall:

- We have 25 local UMW Units with a total of 560 members.
- Our largest Unit is St Ignace with 56 members. Four Units are 10 members strong: Germfask, Negaunee Mitchell, Rockland St Paul's, & Sault Ste Marie.
- Two Units were functioning without a president, one unit operates with a presidential committee, and one unit has a summertime president & a wintertime president.
- Most of our units do not have all ten positions filled but Gwinn, with 32 members, & Manistique, with 28 members, do have a full board as do Greenland & Newberry, each with 12 members.
