MISSION COORDINATOR FOR SPIRITUAL GROWTH

UMW has wisely decided to emphasize conservation. Our planet and its resources are finite. The following activity is a graphic demonstration.

Directions:

- Represent the earth with one large apple. Slice it into equal quarter pieces. Three slices represent And God called the dry land Earth, and the gathering resents earth's land area.
- Slice the 1/4 piece that represents land in half. One half of this quarter slice is inhospitable to humans (rocky mountains, swamps, polar regions, deserts, etc.).
- What fraction now remains? (1/8) This remaining piece is where people live, NOT where they grow their food. Slice the 1/8 piece into four pieces and put three aside. What fraction do you have left? (1/32) The 3 pieces of 1/32 sections set aside represent the areas that are too steep, too rocky, too wet, too cold, or where the soil is too poor to grow food. They also represent shopping malls, cities, parks, factories, suburbs,

- schools, parking lots and other places where food is not grown.
- Very carefully peel the 1/32 slice of the apple. This tiny piece of apple peel represents the very thin surface of the earth's crust (the topsoil, 2 inches to 5 feet deep) upon which we depend for our food and survival.

CHANGES IN THE STANDING RULES FOR 2021

We continue to live into The Standing Rules for 2019 and 2020 that were created for the new conference organization. Several things have had to be adjusted for the way they are being done now. Clarifications of wording and timing were made throughout the document, for example:

The word business was inserted wherever annual meeting was used to indicate the Annual Business Meeting part of the Annual Celebration.

Anywhere the conference newsletter was mentioned the name *The Voice* was used.

The terms Elected/Appointed Leaders was changed to Elected Officers wherever it applied.

The **Section III.** Elected/Appointed Leaders was changed to **Responsibilities of Elected Officers**.

Other more substantive changes are mentioned here.

- I. **Nominations, Elections and Appointive Procedures –** New Letter I. referencing tenure.
- II. Committees

Three parts of the **Section III. Responsibilities of Elected Officers. A. 3,4,5** were shifted to the **Section II. Committees**: **B. Leadership Team**.

- <u>Letter B</u>. **Leadership Team -** Numbers 4 to 8 were replaced with a reorganized Numbers 4 to 8 including the three paragraphs moved from **II. Responsibilities of Elected Officers**
- <u>Letter G.</u> **Committee on Nominations** the membership was adjusted to reflect our current situation. It shall be composed of nine women, one from each district.
- Letter I. Committee on Standing Rules A new 4 was added.
 - 4. District Presidents shall send a copy of the District Standing Rules to the Conference Standing Rules Chairperson when they are revised.
- <u>Letter J.</u> Committee on the Charter for Racial Justice Policies an additional sentence added in No.1.Fifth Line Additional members will be nominated by the Committee on Nominations.
- <u>Letters L ...Directory and M.... Historical Reports</u> were combined into <u>Letter L Committee on the Directory and Reports</u> and subsequent letters shifted down.
- New Letter N. Committee on Mission u clarification of who pays expenses to whom and Attendance at Mission u of Leadership Team members not part of this committee.
- III. Responsibilities of Elected Officers -

Letter A: 3, 4, and 5 were shifted to the **Section II. Committees**: B. Leadership Team. New numbering is 1, 2, 3, 4. Removal of Section B as it is no longer done.

- IV. Meetings Throughout A. Annual Celebration and Business Meeting, adjustments were made to registration procedures related to invited guests. The guests were added to the paragraph of the person inviting them. 2. <u>Publicity and Registration</u> was replaced with a reorganized Number 2. Publicity and Registration
 - Letter C. **Social Action Event** 1. Added correct wording for sponsors and the title of the program "<u>Keep Making Peace</u>"
- V. Funds "members of the Committee on the Charter for Racial Justice Policies" was added to <u>Letter B.</u> Meeting Expenses within the Conference Nos. 4 and 8 and <u>Letter D.</u> Resources No. 1. <u>Letter H.</u> District Budgets and Funds No. 7 referencing interest was deleted.



- VII. **Courtesies** Deletion of A referencing an Honorary President. It does not need to be in the Standing Rules.
- VIII. **Resources Letter A.** The words "obtained from or" in the first sentence and the last sentence referencing publications for sale at conference events have been deleted.
